It was just another day at the Salvation in Christ Orphanage and Humanitarian Refuge Home, Inc. in Liberia. The neighborhood children were invited to play soccer in the compound. Suddenly, something that had never happened changed their fun into fear. Daniel, our 12 year old sponsored youth, was kicked in the head. He couldn't walk, had trouble standing and began throwing up. He was taken to the hospital, admitted and diagnosed with a concussion. Medicines were given and a head scan was required to determine the extent of damage. A few days later, after paying the \$280US bill, he was released with scheduled follow-up visits. Without compassionate donors, who could have paid an average of 7 month's salary for his emergency care? Daniel said, "I am so happy you all helped me. Thank you, donors!"









Raina, age 16, experienced her first medical emergency due to a severe itchy rash over her entire body. The allergy medicines we sent provided no relief: the itch intensified and spreaded. At the clinic she was diagnosed with malaria and a blood infection requiring several injections, topical creams, pills and follow-up visits, totaling \$50US, over a month's salary in Liberia.

No longer is Raina crying in agony over the shame/pain of her condition or the uncertainty of her future. The treatment is working, the itch is subsiding and she is smiling once again because LO/HP, Inc. provided money for her care. The compassion you give is tangible. She is so grateful. Other medical emergencies have occurred. Thank you to donors who *Help Us...Help Them!*

We are seeking donors for our Operation Blessing Project. Seven thousand (\$7,000US) is needed to send a humanitarian aid containers to Liberia, West Africa to distribute thousands of relief items, educational materials, recreation items, and medical supplies to orphanages, child welfare homes, the Blind, seniors, clinics, and poor underprivileged individuals in urban / rural areas.

Last school year we were able to provide full educational scholarships for 39 children, 24 girls/15 boys, with the youngest age 4 in kindergarten and the oldest age 20 in the 11th grade. What was the result of your kindness and investment in their future? All of them completed their course of study and were promoted.





For this school year, we will be sponsoring 33 children at a cost of \$5,683US. The student composition is 18 in elementary school (11 girls and 7 boys), 4 in junior high (2 girls and 2 boys) and 11 in senior high (6 girls and 5 boys). High school fees account for increase costs above last year. All but one is a resident at the SIC Orphanage and Humanitarian Refuge Home, Inc. Nelson, age 13, who is our first Blind resident, will

continue to attend the School of the Blind and live in their compound during the school calendar year with fellow Blind and visually impaired students. THE LADY AND HER RURAL VILLAGE

Our food distribution team first brought this dear woman to our attention late last year as they were visiting different rural villages to distribute food baskets free-of-charge to the poorest among them. The need was so great that the food baskets were broken down to allow more people to receive. After, receiving our donation, the picture to the left was taken and shared with us.

As we reported in our 2024 Winter Newsletter, she is a widow, named Gbezay Kollie and was honored by her fellow villagers to have the Town of Gbezaylon named after her and her late husband for the wonderful work they had done to build up the town. Now in her golden years, she is mostly seen surrounded by children whom she cares for as their parents travel far distances

to work on other people's farms. The above picture immediately spoke volumes of the unmet needs for these rural villages. There was no denying that the children had swollen stomachs. A nurse with the team said it was probably due to malnutrition. We also noticed that the children around her were barely clothed. We decided to include this village in our next food distribution and to include clothing for the children. Unfortunately, our shipment has been delayed for several months. Nevertheless, the decision was made not to further delay distributing much needed rice, seasoning, bath soap and washing soap to them. See the picture to the right. They were so grateful. A greater distribution will be made later this year. We are also seeking \$450US to purchase 100 medical treatments for malaria, typhoid fever and de-worming to be given free to poor rural villagers.



CONSTRUCTION HAS STARTED TOGETHER, WE CAN FINISH IT!





A multi-purpose building within the compound of our sponsored orphanage is under construction. It will house the new boy's dormitory to alleviate overcrowding in their current residential facility. This new building will also have two large multipurpose rooms: one for a new computer lab and the other to be used for sewing and musical instruction.

Construction has been done in phases according to donation levels. We are appealing for the balance of **\$3,500US** to complete this new facility. Help us...help them! Will you give today to this most urgent need?


Our Mission
